

# Minutes IFFS Board of Directors Meeting ASRM | New Orleans, USA & Virtual Sunday, October 15, 2023 | 2:30 – 5:00 pm CEST

1. Welcome Mocanu

E.Mocanu welcomed all to the meeting and introduced the meeting attendees, and thanked all for attending.

#### 2. Approval of previous minutes and action points list

E. Mocanu asked for approval of the minutes and action points list from the Saturday 9 September 2023 Meeting

## 3. IFFS-JSRM Congress 2025



## E. Mocanu summarized:

- April 26-29, 2025 (4 days)
- Venue: Tokyo International Forum
- Hybrid (On-site and On-demand no live streaming)
- Theme: Diversity, Sustainability and Resilience in Reproductive Medicine
- Presidents
  - IFFS2025 Yutaka Osuga
  - o 70 JSRM Masahide Shiotani
- Anticipated attendance: 2,000
  - This was discussed at a later point in the meeting:
    - 600 from overseas including developing countries
    - M. Nagakawa confirmed they were expecting less participation from Japanese delegates due to the Congress taking place in English and the duration of the Congress.
    - E. Mocanu confirmed that all presentations would be translated into Japanese so that should mitigate that risk. There was also flexibility in the duration of the Congress, which could be considered.
- Secretariat: Convention Linkage

IFFS-JSRM Team presented on the status of planning – view slides:

- Sponsorship Planning
  - Target for sponsorship is \$907,000
- Major activities until the end of 2023
- Registration Fee Proposal
  - This was discussed at a later point in the meeting:
    - Clarification required for difference between Participant and Medical Staff.
       M. Nagakawa confirmed that medical staff were nurses and embryologists
    - Japanese Delegates and Developing Countries registration fees were identical – all agreed that this was a good strategy to encourage participation
    - Concerns were raised about the registration fee for overseas. It was agreed that registration fees should be lower than ASPIRE
    - Reduced rate for IFFS should be included
    - A rate for IFFS membership and registration could be offered
- Program time frame
- Promotion

- Social Media is setup

#### **Discussion:**

- Concern was raised regarding the date of the meeting due to ASPIRE's meeting taking place on the 1-4 May 2025 in Singapore. Y. Osuga has discussed this with the ASPIRE President, but no decision can be made until their Board Meeting. Y. Osuga requested that a letter of support be written from the President of IFFS to ask for the ASPIRE President to rethink the dates. E. Mocanu confirmed that an email had been sent to gain clarification of the dates, as they have yet to be confirmed externally.
- It was requested that the IFFS and JSRM logos should be added to all promotional material. Furthermore, there should be some additional names added to the promotional material and E. Mocanu asked M. Nagakawa to contact the secretariat for full details
- E. Mocanu reported that a Scientific Committee Meeting had taken place and good progress had been made with program planning
- It was confirmed that the IFFS Scientific Committee would like to invite local and regional representation to the Committee. E. Mocanu requested the IFFS-JSRM discuss this internally and suggest 3 or 4 potential representatives. This was further expanded to include representatives from all ASPIRE countries. This invitation should be sent from both IFFS and JSRM.
- It was discussed whether there would simultaneous translation and it was confirmed that there would not.
- There was discussion about whether Speakers should be expected to translate their presentations, as there were concerns on the quality, accuracy, and expectation. This was not resolved in discussion.
- Further discussion took place regarding the date of the Congress, and whether it could be
  moved especially with any contractual obligations. It was asked whether IFFS-JSRM team
  could discuss this internally and feedback to the committee.

Action: Secretariat to draft letter from IFFS President to ASPIRE President and Board regarding Congress dates in 2025

Action: IFFS-JSRM team to add IFFS and JSRM logos to all promotional material

Action: M. Nagakawa to contact IFFS secretariat for full details on additional names to be added to the promotional materials

Action: IFFS-JSRM team to discuss potential local and regional representatives that could join the Scientific Committee. A list of 3 or 4 individuals should be submitted to the committee.

Action: IFFS-JSRM team to invite representatives from all ASPIRE countries to join the Scientific Committee



Action: IFFS-JSRM team to reduce registration fees to ensure that they are lower than ASPIRE (10%)

Action: IFFS-JSRM to discuss possibility of moving the dates of Congress, based on current contractual obligations i.e. venue and feedback to the Committee

Action: Secretariat and IFFS-JSRM to schedule a follow up meeting with the Committee to feedback on all the above action points

Action: IFFS-JSRM team to add IFFS Member reduced registration rate

#### 5. Membership

## E. Manalo reported:

- Associated Society Membership 3 (1 new society African Federation of Fertility Societies)
- Society Membership 75, however, 20 Active (paid their dues)
- 1 new Society since September Fertility Society of TOGO



- Non-active society members were contacted to remind them to pay their dues in June and further follow ups will take place
- Individual Membership 38 Active Members, four new individual members since September, three of which were recruited at FIGO
- Lifetime Membership 3
- The plans for connecting with members include:
  - Monthly communication on GRH
  - Enduring participation at societies annual general meeting: Message from President (virtual or physical where possible)
  - Ensuring regular engagements with presidents of member societies and ExCO
  - Intensify new membership drive
  - Establish regional ambassadors

#### Discussion

- It was requested that a list be provided to the committee of all Societies that had not paid their dues
- There was criticism of the Membership status report, as it did not reflect the current status
- It was asked whether the Surveillance Ambassadors could be the Regional Ambassadors this was confirmed
- It was confirmed at FIGO that there are an estimated 135 National Obs&Gyn Societies that are members of FIGO, it was agreed that a letter should be sent to the FIGO Chair, from the President of IFFS requesting for further information/ contact details of fertility societies in the countries where FIGO has member societies.
- It was asked whether there was a way to incentivise Society Members to recruit individual
  members. However, it was confirmed that this was never the intention for their role. It was
  clarified that individual members represented persons from countries where there was not a
  National society but the existence of a society is not a reason for not becoming an individual
  IFFS member.
- It was agreed that there was a failure in the communication of membership benefits, which needs to be improved. It was confirmed that an action point from the Strategy Meeting was that a full membership benefit review would take place, some ideas that were tabled:
  - It was agreed that a benefit to some lower, middle income members would be a membership certificate
  - o Reduction in fees to attend annual Congress
  - Formation of International Committees to encourage engagement from individual members
- It was asked whether a Society could have an opportunity to showcase their work in the newsletter, Journal and/or website



• It was discussed that a promotional email could be sent to ASRM delegates to offer them discounted membership for IFFS

Action: Secretariat to provide a report of Inactive societies (not paid dues) by the next EC meeting

Action: Secretariat to provide an updated report of Membership Status at current date, by the next EC

Meeting

Action: Secretariat to prepare a letter to the Chair of FIGO to request the details of the National Society members

#### 6. Education

#### R. Kennedy reported:

- The first two courses are complete however, marketing has been a challenge. A Marketing support contract has been signed and promotion will start imminently
- The Third course Ovarian Stimulation which contains 19 presentations is nearing completion.
   The target for this is end of November 2023
- The fourth course, has confirmed funding from Abbot to develop an online course on all elements of Progesterone in Reproductive Health
- New subject areas are being considered in order to develop a pipeline of education content for 2024

#### 7. Finances

## R. Pai reported:

- Awaiting further information regarding the World Congress (Athens) financial position
- Current financial position including income and expenses and investments, as at end of August 2023
- There was a concern that the individual membership did not reflect the correct amount and it was requested that the budget be reviewed
- Further clarification was requested regarding the 'Unknown Wire Transfer' line item of \$5,500, it was confirmed that this was received a couple of days before the meeting and had not yet been allocated
- It was noted that the current financial situation, as of today was:
  - Investments Berkshire Hetaway Inc. \$7,974
  - IFFS Bank Account Balances PNC Bank Account \$178,025 & HSBC Bank Account -\$84,492
  - Total value of investments and bank account balances: \$270,491
- It is expected that the Congress budget will break even but final details have yet to be reviewed and audited

Action: Secretariat to review budget and check all figures especially individual membership and unknown wire transfer line item

## E. Mocanu presented the website updates:

#### 9. Surveillance

#### S. Ory reported:

- The contract for MedSolutions has been finalised
- All 13 Regional Directors (RDs) have been engaged
- RDs have been contacted and have national respondents lined up
- The Questionnaire timeline has been adjusted as follows:
  - Circulated end of November 2023
  - Completion before end of January 2024
- The mechanism for the collection of the questionnaire has been confirmed at the Surveillance Meeting at ASRM
- An interactive website is work in progress, which will display the Surveillance data from 2022. This will be a user-friendly, engaging and high impact way of presenting the data.
- A group of Legal Scholars, Law Professors from University's around the world, has been formed and will be meeting on November 1, 2023 via Zoom. There is a perception that there is no international group for these individuals to discuss their challenges, so this will fulfil the need. The meeting will hopefully lead to a face-to-face meeting in Tokyo.

#### 10. Audit Committee

## Tina reported:

- The access requested to financial folders and reports, has yet to be complete. Tina has access but the other two members of the AC do not have access.
- Awaiting information from the final budget from the World Congress in Athens, once this is received the AC will provide feedback
- AC will be meeting with President and Treasurer to discuss expanded AC tasks at ASRM
- Emra will be stepping back from her role on the AC and discussion will take place about suitable replacements
- 2022 Tax reports has been completed
- 2023 Tax reports are in progress

Action: Secretariat to provide access to all members of AC to financial folders and reports



## 11. Athens World Congress

- E. Mocanu presented the Erasmus report, which was discussed:
  - The Congress evaluation showed excellent feedback in general
  - The feedback should be considered with 2025 program planning, as there are lots of opportunities to improve, this would be a task of the Education committee
  - It was confirmed that all presentations have been received from Erasmus
  - It was suggested that all participants at Athens should have targeted promotion to register early for Tokyo 2025, with a reduced rate
  - There was a feedback comment that there were not enough Embryology sessions, and it was agreed that this should be a focus of the Scientific Committee for Tokyo 2025
    - o It was suggested that a dedicated Embryology session hall be set up in Tokyo 2025
  - It was stated that an Educational Review Committee will be set up to review the presentations from Athens. However, there was concern that this would take time.
    - It was suggested that Keynotes, Trilogies, Eponymous Speeches would be uploaded for viewing in the members-only area of the website. However, the list of consent by speakers would need to be cross-checked to ensure that correct authorization was given prior to upload.
    - 30 second promotional clips could be created from the video content from the Congress, which will advertise and drive to full videos on the website
  - It was confirmed the Pre-Congress courses were not recorded
  - It was asked whether additional targeted Nurse content should be added to the Tokyo 2025 program. It was suggested that pre-congress workshop could be scheduled which could be a follow-up to an online module. An invitation should be sent to Alison McTavish to join the Education Committee to develop the module and pre-congress workshop
  - It was suggested that a reduced rate is provided for nurses to attend Tokyo 2025
  - There was discussion about providing content for Genetic Counsellors and Al. It was agreed that there were lots of suggestions and they should be noted and reviewed by the Education and Scientific Programme Committee

Action: Secretariat to circulate the report to all (attached)

Action: Education Committee to review and consolidate the education feedback, for further discussion at program planning meetings for Annual Congress 2025

Action: Secretariat to add positive congress feedback comments to the website

Action: Secretariat/IFFS-JSRM to send promotional early registration reduced rate email to Congress participants from Athens, when registration is open

Action: Scientific Committee to invite key Embryologist to speak at Tokyo 2025, based on feedback from the Erasmus report

Action: Secretariat to request list of Speakers who have not provided consent/ did not give approval from Erasmus



Action: Secretariat to add Embryology dedicated session hall suggestion to next Scientific Committee meeting

Action: Education committee to send an invitation for Alison Mctavish to join the committee

Action: Secretariat to organize the creation of 30 second promotional clips from video presentations from Athens 2023

Action: Education and Scientific Programme Committee to liaise and review suggestions provided in this meeting

Action: Upon agreement to display the recorded presentation in the "member only" area of the IFFS website

#### 12. Science and IFFS Journal

A. DeCherney reported on the journal updates:

- It is now easier to upload manuscript submissions to the journal using an online form
- Letters have been sent to those who presented at Athens to invite them to upload their presentations, with a guideline of 1500 words, two illustrations (optional) and 10 references
- Letters have been sent out to potential reviewers to join for a maximum of 3 articles per year
- A history of IFFS book will be created for Tokyo 2025, which will include interviews with all living President's
- Good recovery for papers received since the pandemic, 30 papers received in 2023 already

Action: A. DeCherney to send first author list to Secretariat

#### 13. Demographic Project

E. Mocanu reported:

- David and Bart's IFFS Statement manuscript has been approved for publication, which will be online in roughly 3 weeks-time (mid-November 2023)
- A group had been engaged in New York, who have created a bespoke website/ video messaging around the campaign 'More Joy', which was presented
- · This will be located on the IFFS website
- It was discussed whether the wording 'Prioritize Fertility Care' should be changed from the call to action to Recognise/ Embrace based on feedback/ pushback to the paper. However, after discussion it was decided this should stay as is: Prioritise Fertility Care
- It was requested that all translations be checked

Action: All More Joy translations to be checked.

#### 14. Any other business



• It was stated that the Board needs to have representation from the major constituencies in Fertility services, as it current doesn't. It was agreed that this should be added to the Strategic Planning documentation.

Action: Secretariat to add Board representation comment, as above, to the Strategic Planning minutes

Dublin, Ireland 29<sup>th</sup> June 2024

Dear IFFS Board members, dear colleagues,

welcome to the IFFS Board of Directors meeting at ESHRE 2024, Amsterdam, Netherlands.

Since the last BOD meeting in October 2023 (ASRM, New Orleans) a lot has been achieved with the efforts of our Office, you the leadership of the organisation and engaged third parties bringing specific expertise to our ambitious programmes.

#### **IFFS** Consensus paper

Our Scientific Director, Bart Fauser and his co-authors have pursued the conception and delivery, together with colleagues from around the word, of the IFFS Consensus paper detailing the dramatic fall in demographics on the planet, raising the alarm and providing solutions as well as a few calls to action.



## More Joy Campaign

The natural consequence of the scientific evidence provided by the Consensus, the More Joy campaign was launched on the 10<sup>th</sup> of January 2024 same day as the publication of the paper. Thanks go to Susan Lamontagne and the More Joy Task Force including Luca Gianaroli, Marcos Horton, Bart Fauser, our webmaster and the social media people, Antti Peerhentupa and Rishma Pai.

The activities promoting the More Joy, during the last 6 months, include a webinar and life presentations in Tunisia, Hong Kong, Buenos Aires, Sao Paolo, Dublin and Manila, etc.

## **Education and Academy**

Our Director of Global Education, Luca Gianaroli, continues to identify opportunities, gel activities and inspire new educational programmes for our audiences. Please ensure you stay connected with him, in the name of your own society ask for collaboration plans and promote IFFS as the Global educational society of choice. Our Past President Richard Kennedy, once again delivered two CME accredited Academy Courses on *Introduction to Infertility-the basics* and *Ovarian stimulation in special clinical situations*.

## IFFS Triennial Report and Global Reproductive Health

For the last 12 months Steve Ory and Kathy Miller have developed and deployed the campaign to collect data and are now in the process to analyse it. Much appreciated are Steve's efforts to expand the knowledge community by inviting legal professionals that can offer the "know how" related to laws in different countries and give the confidence that the data collected is authentic. We await his report in Tokyo, gossip is that this is the largest feedback ever. Be sure you promote this unique publication among your society members. With Alan DeCherney at the helm, Global Reproductive Health is finding its place in the sea of publications in our field. A think tank to explore GRH's future was initiated and hopefully a novel presentation is to be established soon.

#### **Membership**

The combined efforts of Eileen Manalo and Oladapo Ashiru, to promote IFFS in their regions, to organise activities and to be ambassadors for the More Joy campaign have created significant interest in our Federation and applications for membership. Our Federation is only as viable as the engagement of its members and the IFFS is in the process of redefining the way we interact with our societies, a first example being the webinar "IFFS Listens" that took place on the 19<sup>th</sup> of June with 25 societies participating.

## **Finances**

In a world where sponsorship is constantly diminishing, where conflicts have limited travel and access, the sourcing of finances to keep the IFFS going remains a challenge. While the balance sheet is positive, we need to continue planning for annual incomes that support the activities we deliver. With the support of IFFS leaders we have managed to continue pursuing innovative projects that appeal to sponsors and we hope this trend to continue for the foreseeable future.



## **World Congress**

The IFFS 25<sup>th</sup> Congress in Tokyo is a must for all our societies. It will be a celebration of scientific achievements, engagement with the next generation and promoting the More Joy message and call to action. It is the time when all members societies meet for 2 sessions to hear what the Federation has done and also to welcome new societies, elect their next leadership and member societies on the Board. Also to plan the next World Congress and vote for the next Scientific Committee which will organise the science for the IFFS 2028 Congress. I encourage your society to be well represented in Tokyo, pay its dues to ensure a voice. Also to invite all neighbouring country societies to engage and participate in the Congress in Japan. Particularly as it will be the 70<sup>th</sup> celebration of JSRM, deserving a show of society national flags and a good delegation from each country. The programme is finished and registration has started. Support your trainees and encourage them to submit scientific abstracts and register.

#### WHO NSA

The IFFS participated at the WHO Policy and Co-ordination Committee (PCC) meeting in April 2024 in Geneva. This year the IFFS proposed the creation of a stand-alone infertility research programme part of the WHO HRP. The proposal was welcomed by representatives of China, Chile, Italy and Georgia. The 2024-2027 Workplan has also been submitted to WHO in order to retain the NSA status for the IFFS.

#### **IFFS Office**

Thanks go to Liam and Olivia, our ICS team that ensures continuity and efficient running of the IFFS Office. We also rely on Olga and Iqbal to offer external expertise, many thanks.

Last but not least I would like to thank the Executive Committee, the advisors and the larger Board for their support and for their commitment to the IFFS. I believe we can make further progress and I look forward to seeing you all in Denver and of course in Tokyo.

Triennial Report for IFFS Board

June 26, 2024

The online survey for the 2025 IFFS Triennial Report officially concluded on March 31, 2024. The 2024 survey exceeded all previous years' participation with 113 countries submitting responses. For the first time, we will now include the previous (2021) responses for nine countries that completed the survey in 2021 but not in 2024. They include Denmark, Lebanon, Mauritius, New Zealand, Polska, Serbia, Sweden, Switzerland and the Netherlands. Thus, we will have 122 countries included in our data base, surpassing the 2018 record of 97 countries. The Regional Directors deserve a great deal of credit for this record engagement drive.

We have reorganized the Editorial Board and for the 2025 publication, we prioritized recruiting authors that were internationally recognized for expertise in the topics that they were invited to cover for the Triennial Report. The IFFS Jurists Special Interest Group, now chaired by Sonia Allan, has expressed enthusiasm for the project and six of them will be co-authoring chapters that principally address recent relevant legislative changes. They will be reviewing their data as a group during a webinar scheduled for later this month. The new Editorial Board members are listed on the attachment. They have recently received the 2024 data set and are now preparing their chapters. We remain on schedule for the presentation of data and circulation of the print copy of the 2025 Triennial Report at the World Congress in Tokyo in May 2025.
